
Misawa Air Base is located in Misawa City on the shores of Lake Ogawara in the Aomori Prefecture. Misawa is approximately 400 miles north of Tokyo, on the northeastern part of the main island of Honshu. Unlike the Tokyo area, this region of Japan is rural and known for its slower pace of life. Misawa is uniquely located close to the Pacific Ocean, mountains and several Japanese national landmarks.

Mission

The 35th Fighter Wing is the host unit at Misawa Air Base and is the only combined joint service installation in the Western Pacific. The wing's mission is to "Protect U.S. interests in the Pacific and defend Japan; deter adversaries through our presence, readiness and ability to project combat air power." The 35th Fighter Wing is the "Point on the tip of the spear."

Population Served

The Misawa Air Base community is made up of Air Force, Navy and Army Active Duty members and their families. We also have a large community of Japanese personnel working with the Japanese Air Self Defense Force (JASDF) operating at Misawa Air Base. See the population chart listed in the table below:





The **35th Fighter Wing** was originally activated at Johnson Air Base, Japan on Aug. 18, 1948. Today the wing carries the bestowed honors of the Army Air Force's 35th Fighter Group, established on Dec. 22, 1939.

Throughout the various reorganizations, designations, inactivations and activations, many installations throughout the world became home to the 35th Fighter Wing and its changing mission. Originally the 35th flew air defense over Japan, but in 1950 the wing deployed a tactical group and two squadrons to support ground forces during the Korean War.

From 1971 to 1992 the 35th called George Air Force Base, California home. During **Operation Desert Storm**, the 35th operated out of Bahrain and played a key role in the war's successful air campaign, flying 3,072 combat missions totaling more than 10,000 hours. From May 1993–Sept. 1995, the 35th operated out of a Naval Air Station in Keflavik, Iceland.

After a 37-year absence, the 35th returned to its roots on Oct. 1, 1994 when it replaced and assumed the mission of the 423rd Fighter Wing at Misawa Air Base. Since achieving initial operating capability with F-16CJ aircrafts in 1996, the wing's fighter squadron deployed nine times to southwest Asia for **Operation Southern Watch** and three times for **Operation Northern Watch**. In March 2003, the 14th Fighter Squadron supported **Operation Iraqi Freedom** while deployed to Southwest Asia, flying 238 combat sorties for 1,336 hours including mission over Baghdad during "Shock and Awe," the opening night of the war.

Throughout the 35th Fighter Group and 35th Fighter Wing's sixty-six year history, they have flown 25 different aircrafts.

Its major unit awards and citations include a Distinguished Unit Citation, Presidential Unit Citations, Republic of Korea Presidential Unit Citation, six Air Force Outstanding Unit Awards with Combat "V" device, eight Air Force Outstanding Unit Awards and three Republic of Vietnam Gallantry Crosses with Palm.

Requesting a Sponsor

You SHOULD have a sponsor from your unit! Your sponsor will get in touch with you via telephone, email or mail shortly after you receive your orders. If you do not hear from your sponsor and you need assistance in establishing contact, go through your local Airman & Family Readiness Center for assistance. Be sure to indicate your gaining unit and your current phone number, email and mailing address in the request. Your sponsor will be your primary contact and provide you with answers to your questions and concerns. Air Force

When the base is notified of an inbound member, the 35th Force Support Squadron, Military Personnel Section (MPS) will send an Assignment Notification RIP to the gaining unit commander support staff. A sponsor will be assigned and the completed Assignment Notification RIP with the unit commander endorsement will be returned to MPS. The assigned sponsor will then make contact with the inbound member. If you have not been contacted by your sponsor, email the A&FRC Relocation Manager at 35fss.fsc@us.af.mil to request assistance.

Make sure to confirm arrival plans before departing and inform **your sponsor about any changes**. Navy

Gaining command should automatically assign a sponsor to all prospective gains as soon as they receive orders or notification for the gaining sailor. If, however, your sponsor has not contacted you, please email nafcsc@fe.navy.mil to request a sponsor.

Keeping Medical (TRICARE) Coverage

You should be covered by your previous TRICARE region until you inprocess with the Misawa Air Base TRICARE Office. For non-urgent care at non-military clinics during your PCS, you will need pre-authorization from your losing TRICARE Regional Office. ***Make sure you have the contact information from your losing TRICARE Regional Office during your PCS.*** For urgent care, you can be treated at **ANY** emergency room and be covered by your losing TRICARE region.

Traveling to Misawa

Traveling from Seattle to the Misawa Air Mobility Command (AMC) Terminal

The recommended use of travel to and from Misawa Air Base, Japan is the AMC Patriot Express. The Patriot Express (sometimes referred to as the Rotator) is a chartered commercial flight, which departs from the Seattle-Tacoma International (SEATAC) Airport and arrives directly at Misawa Air Base once a week. Travelers with pets are highly encouraged to use this method to travel.

All passengers are required to be travel ready at the start of roll call/show time. To be considered travel ready, passengers must have all required documents, checked baggage and all accompanying family members.

Commercial Travel Through Tokyo

Tokyo has two international airports, Narita and Haneda. All commercial flights from the U.S. will land at one of these airports. However, the only flights from Tokyo to Misawa are from Haneda. If you are arriving at Narita, please be mindful of the flight timetables to make the connection flight from Haneda to Misawa, as those flights are limited.

Note: Japan has a very efficient luggage and ski and snowboard delivery system called Takkyubin (Black Cat Couriers). The service is available to and from the airport, as well as most hotels, to make traveling a lot easier. You won't need to carry your heavy bags up and down platforms or stairs. Black Cat Couriers can deliver your heavy or oversize bags directly to Misawa Air Base.

The Misawa Inn will not take accountability or sign for your bags. You must make arrangements with your sponsor if you choose to use this method.

Traveling to Misawa

Overnight Accommodation in Tokyo

Ensure that you have enough time to clear Customs & Immigrations at the airport, collect your bags and then make the connections from Narita to Haneda by bus (depending on traffic). If you arrive at Narita after 2 p.m., you may need to reserve an overnight accommodation near Narita. Check with the information counter in the hotel for shuttle service. For cost efficiency, you may want to consider staying in a hotel close to Narita and then transfer to Haneda in the morning. Be sure to check what time you will need to catch the bus to Haneda, so you make it to Misawa on time.

Traveling with Pets

If traveling on a commercial flight, all incoming animals must clear the Japanese Animal Quarantine service at Narita International Airport.

U.S. flagged commercial airlines and Japan Air Line (JAL) will not accept pets when the temperature is above 85 degrees from May 15–Sept. 15 each year. **For certain breeds, the "temperature acceptance restriction" is 70 degrees!** Please confirm the current temperature acceptance restrictions policy when you book your flight. Booking an early morning or late evening flight could help avoid delays due to the temperature acceptance restrictions.

After Arriving at Misawa Air Base

Reporting Procedures

Personnel traveling to Misawa commercially will arrive at the Misawa City Airport. Personnel traveling to Misawa through government travel will arrive at the AMC passenger terminal on Misawa Air Base. Your sponsor should meet you at the airport or AMC terminal if you relayed your travel plans. Air Force members will go and check in at the Misawa Inn and Navy sailors will go and check in at the Navy Gateway Inn. Unaccompanied Air Force E-4 and below or Navy E-6 and below may be directly assigned to a dormitory after arrival at the Misawa Inn or Navy Gateway Inn, depending on availability in the dorms.

Air Force Inprocessing: Your sponsor will take you to your unit for inprocessing either the day-of or the next duty day following your arrival. Your gaining unit commander's support staff will register you in the Misawa SharePoint for Misawa Air Base Newcomers Orientation. This action begins your in-processing and schedules you for the **MANDATORY** Right Start Briefing that is held every Wednesday.

Must attend before the second week of arrival.

Driver's License Training (USFJ Form 4EJ):

Every Tuesday at 9 a.m. | Building 653, Room 219

Must bring stateside driver's license.

Finance Inprocessing:

Bring two copies of orders, plus all receipts. This must be completed within the first five duty days of your arrival.

Right Start:

Every Wednesday at 7:15 a.m. | Mokuteki Ballroom

Information Fair at 2 p.m.

Military personnel must report in uniform for AFI required briefings, inprocessing and completion of paperwork from medical, TRICARE and the A&FRC. Then participate in an Info Fair with local agencies from the base. Family members are encouraged to attend.

Items to Bring: Please bring all inprocessing documents from your losing base or your last assignment to the Right Start Briefing. This includes **multiple copies** of PCS orders & amendments, post office box number, and local contact information (duty phone number or cell number).

Cultural City Tour:

Every Friday | Meet at the Mokuteki Ballroom

NLT 7:30 a.m. to receive safety instructions

Enjoy a tour of Misawa and Hachinohe. The tour is sponsored by the A&FRC. You will be signed up for the tour during the Right Start Briefing.

Officer First Duty Station: If Misawa is your first duty station you must attend the mandatory financial briefing that is held once a quarter at the A&FRC in the Torii Building. 656.

Airman First Duty Station: If Misawa is your first duty station, you are required to attend the First Term Airman orientation at the First Term Airman Center (FTAC). This orientation must be attended within 30 days of your arrival. You will be signed up for FTAC by your unit. Please contact the Professional Development Center (PDC) office at DSN: (315) 226-7829, if you have any questions.

Navy Inprocessing and Base Indoctrination: You must inprocess within 24 hours of arrival to Misawa Air Base. Check-in is by appointment only at the Personnel Support Detachment (PSD), building 980. You or your sponsor can schedule the appointment to check in.

Please bring the following items with you to your check-in appointment: original orders, overseas screening, mailbox number and all travel receipts. All Active Duty Navy personnel are **required** to attend a five-day orientation course to include Base Indoctrination and Overseas Duty Support Program (Japan Indoctrination) and driving safely in Japan. Dependents are welcome to attend Base Indoctrination and Overseas Duty Support Program. The last day of indoctrination is the Cultural City Tour. All Active Duty members will be scheduled upon arrival. The point of contact for the U.S. Naval Air Facility, Misawa Administration Office is DSN: (315) 226-3811.

After Arriving at Misawa Air Base

Driver's License

Important Notes: If your stateside license is revoked or suspended from a previous base, then your license will have the same status here.

All personnel must be at least 16 years old to operate vehicles on base and at least 18 years old to operate vehicles off base.

Required: U.S. Forces Japan (USFJ) personnel must have a valid stateside driver's license and possess a valid local USFJ Form 4EJ Operator's Permit to operate a privately owned vehicle.

In order to obtain a USFJ Form 4EJ, personnel must attend the Traffic Safety Course II, Driver's Orientation & Local Conditions Briefing, which is held every Tuesday in building 653, room 219 from 9–10 a.m.

Personnel in attendance need to bring their military I.D., valid stateside driver's license and a copy of their orders. Following the brief, personnel in attendance will complete a written test and then they will be given their USFJ Form 4EJ.

Personnel who DO NOT have a stateside driver's license will be given a Student Permit that is good for 90 days (good for on base only). After issue of their permit, they can attend an AAA driver's course through the Community Commons. Upon successful completion of the road test, the driver needs to bring their Student Permit and Certificate of Completion to the Pass and Registration Office to get issued a full license (on base only for individuals under the age of 18).

After Arriving at Misawa Air Base Finding a House

Note: Mandatory assignment to on-base family housing began on Sept. 1, 2009 for all accompanied Active Duty members!

Required: You must report to the Housing Office within 24-hours of your arrival!

All new personnel arriving in Misawa require a briefing at the Housing Office or the Consolidated Dorm Management Office, as part of inprocessing to discuss entitlements, eligibility and to receive their assignment to a residence or dorm (if applicable). Rank and family size will determine your eligibility and waiting time. Unaccompanied Air Force E-4 & Below are currently required to live on base in the dormitory.

Contact the Air Force Dormitory Manager at **DSN: 315-226-4000** to reserve a dormitory room. Your assigned sponsor should assist you with getting your dormitory room.

Unaccompanied Navy E-4 and below are currently required to live in Unaccompanied Housing (UH).

The Navy Unaccompanied Housing can be reached at **DSN: 315-226-9376 (8 a.m.-4 p.m., Monday-Friday JST)**. Your assigned sponsor should assist you with getting a UH room.

There are outdoor gazebos and barbecue pits available for residents to use. The dorms are within walking distance to the Misawa Air Base Post Office, Shoppette, Burger King, Popeyes, Dining Facility, Café Mokuteki and the Potter Fitness Center. Farther down the road is the Community Bank, Navy Federal Credit Union, Commissary, Base Exchange and the Misawa Air Base front gate (Friendship Gate, which allows immediate access to shopping, restaurants and more in Misawa City).

All rooms are fully furnished with a refrigerator, microwave, a desk and chair, full-size bed, night-stand and a wardrobe closet. Air Force dorm rooms have a private entrance and a private bath. Navy UH rooms share a bath with the adjoining room. Each building includes TV lounges, recreation rooms and laundry facilities. **Smoking is NOT permitted inside any dormitory!**

Accompanied Members or Unaccompanied Air Force E-5 and above or Unaccompanied Navy E-5 and above can reserve Temporary Living Facilities (TLF) for their incoming families. Reservations are taken on a first come, first serve basis. Get the help of your sponsor or call the Misawa Inn at **DSN: (315) 222-0282** to make reservations in advance.

Be sure to have your credit card ready and the exact date of your arrival. If you need special assistance, be sure to include that in your request. You are authorized in TLF for five days on a space-available basis and also availability of housing. Pet friendly accommodation is also available. Please contact the lodging facility for more information.

Government Housing: If your orders do not state that you are on an accompanied or a joint-sponsor tour or your dependents are not listed on your PCS orders, then you must provide proof of your accompanied tour/command sponsorship to be eligible for government housing. This may be in a letter issued by your servicing personnel office or PSD Form 11101/1. If your dependents do not initially accompany you to Misawa, they must arrive within 30 days of you accepting government housing.

Family housing units are located in two separate housing areas, Main Base and North Base. North Base is approximately a ten minute drive from Main Base.

Recently, air conditioning units have been installed in North Base homes and many of the homes on Main Base. A/C units will be installed in the remaining homes during the base renovation project. If your home does not have an A/C unit, you can buy a floor/room model. Please check with the Housing Office for approved specifications.

Pet owners must comply to the Pet Policy for base housing. If you are a pet owner, please ask for the Pet Policy during your initial base housing briefing.

Off-Base Housing: If you are single, an NCO or an Officer, you are likely to be required to live off base. The Housing Office maintains a list of off-base rental properties, maps of the local Misawa area and a list of English-speaking real estate agents to assist you in your search. A sponsor will be extremely helpful during this process, since some real estate agents will provide you a housing list, then expect you to view the homes on your own.

It is extremely important that individuals know their responsibilities as outlined under the Japanese lease agreement. All lease agreements are between the rental agent and the military member. **The Housing Office may assist in resolving any disputes, however, the military member is ultimately responsible to resolve the issue!**

Cars

Note: Before you leave your last assignment or base, contact your current car insurance company to see if it will provide you with a "No Claim Policy" letter, which states that you have not filed a recent accident claim with them. One or two of the local car insurance companies will accept this letter and give you a 10% discount on your first year insurance policy.

Many people in Misawa buy used cars here. The average price is \$2,000 to \$4,000; with SUV's, Jeeps and vans prices upward to \$7,000. This price will vary depending on if you buy a used car from another SOFA member or go downtown to one of the Japanese car dealerships right outside the front or back gate.

When you buy a used car, please ensure that the Japanese Road Tax (due every April) is paid and that the Japanese Compulsory Insurance (JCI) is current.

The cost of Japanese Road Tax is based on the engine size, which is represented by numbered-license plates. Other costs of owning this car is the JCI. This is due every two years and the cost begins at \$500, possibly going higher depending on the safety condition of the car at the time of its inspection.

Fast Facts: The world's first non-stop trans-pacific flight was launched from Sabishiro Beach near Misawa on Oct. 4 1931, when Clyde Pangborn and Hugh Herndon departed in a CH-400 Skyrocket named "Miss Veedol." Misawa's modern military history goes back to the construction of an airstrip in Misawa in 1938 by the Imperial Japanese Army. In 1942, the Japanese Naval Air Force controlled the base and used it for long-range bombers. During World War II, Misawa was primarily a kamikaze training base. One month after the Japanese announced surrender, on Aug. 15 1945, American troops arrived in Misawa. In December 1946, the 49th Fighter Group became the first U.S. air unit stationed at Misawa.

Location: 40 degrees and 40 minutes north latitude and 141 degrees and 23 minutes east longitude. This is approximately the same latitude as Central Park in New York City; Newark, New Jersey; Kearney, Nebraska; Peoria, Illinois; Lima, Ohio and Salt Lake City, Utah.

Geographical Features: Misawa City is located in the southeastern portion of the Aomori Prefecture on the northern end of Honshu Island. The Pacific Ocean lies east and Lake Ogawara northwest. It is surrounded by the towns of Tohoku Town on the west and the towns of Shimoda and Momoishi to the south. Misawa City is shaped like a rectangle and is 11 kilometers wide (east-west) by 25 kilometers long (north-south). It covers an area of 120.76 square kilometers (46.6 square miles) and has an elevation of approximately 130 feet.

Misawa has an airport, JR Eastern Japan Train Station, and Towada Kanko Dentetsu Station. Because Route 338 is along the Pacific coastline, Misawa is a transportation focal point to go to Lake Towada, Shimokita Peninsula, the northern part of Sanriku coast in Iwate Prefecture to Hachinohe, Towada, Aomori and Mutsu cities.

Population: Misawa is a 'small' city with a population of approximately 40,000 people.

WINTER: (December–February) Winter temperatures average slightly below freezing. Misawa isn't too cold but we get a lot of snow. Misawa is the snowiest US Air Force Base in the world. While stationed here you will be within driving distance to world class ski resorts and fresh powder.

SPRING: (March–May) Spring in northern Honshu starts out cold and has plenty of snow. The average daily temperature is 36 degrees Fahrenheit and monthly snowfall is less than 20 inches. Spring warms to bring beautiful cherry blossoms and other flowering plants to life.

SUMMER: (June–August) Summers in Misawa have mild temperatures with increased rain and humidity. We do experience the occasional typhoon in the summer and early fall. Not to worry, there are plenty of warm, sunny days to explore the area and many nearby beaches.

FALL: (September–November) September signals the end of the summer season in Misawa as temperature lower to an average of 66 degrees Fahrenheit. By the end of the fall season, temperatures are cooler. The excellent weather and changing of the autumn leaves make this a gorgeous time of year.



Annual 50




Average High Temperature (Fahrenheit)

Enjoying Japanese Holidays



- Do not forget to make or cancel restaurant reservations.



