



WEASEL NOTAM – 35FW- 25-14
Morale T-shirt Wear & Approval
11 December 2025



PURPOSE: To standardize the creation, tracking, and wear standards of morale shirts across the 35th Fighter Wing.

COMMANDER'S INTENT: The 35 FW Commander's intent is to allow USAF members assigned to Misawa Air Base the option to wear colored morale T-shirts.

BACKGROUND: IAW CSAF memorandum *Air Force Memorandum to DAFI 36-2903, Dress and Personal Appearance Interim Guidance*, 10 Nov 25, the 35 FW Commander is implementing the following guidance for wearing morale T-shirts, effective immediately.

IMPLEMENTATION:

1. All personnel are encouraged to wear their squadron's morale T-shirt with utility uniforms on Fridays, provided the member is not deployed or participating in an exercise, IAW CSAF guidance and DAFI 36-2903, Dress and Appearance of Air Force Personnel.
2. T-shirts must be authorized by the squadron commander prior to wear and must reflect the authorized heraldry and heritage colors of the member's assigned squadron. Squadrons must submit authorized designs to the CCEA org box, 35fw.electroniccoordination@us.af.mil, which will be filed on the 35 FW SharePoint for record. The submission must include full-color images of the front and back of the T-shirt, and all text must be legible (digital concepts/designs are permitted).
3. If a squadron does not have a morale T-shirt, personnel may wear the approved 35 FW morale T-shirt.
4. As an interim measure only valid until the fielding of an official wing T-shirt, personnel may wear a royal-blue T-shirt.

SUBJECT: Air Force Memorandum to DAFI 36-2903, Dress and Personal Appearance Interim Guidance

Our uniform reflects years of Airmen bound by a proud heritage and united in shared purpose. It connects us to those who came before and signals professionalism, discipline, and continued unity in today's force. To strengthen that connection and esprit de corps, the following updates to the Air Force Dress and Personal Appearance standards will take effect 14 November 2025 and applies exclusively to United States Air Force (USAF) personnel.

Morale Shirts: When authorized by the unit commander, USAF members may wear Colored T-shirts on Fridays with utility uniforms, provided the member is not deployed, participating in an exercise, or assigned to a joint or Space Force unit. The color must reflect the authorized heraldry and heritage colors of the member's assigned unit. Commanders may authorize members of supporting units to wear the same-colored T-shirts. For example, maintainers and flight surgeons may wear the same T-shirts as the flying unit they support. Wing commanders will maintain a list of approved colors for wear within their wing.

Nametags: Callsigns are now authorized for daily wear on flight duty and desert flight duty uniform nametags. Officer nametags may incorporate the member's Callsign or first name followed by last name. Enlisted personnel will incorporate rank, followed by the member's Callsign and last name. Commanders will ensure that nametags are in good taste and reflect proper military order, discipline, morale, and professional image.

The incorporation of this guidance into relevant regulations is forthcoming. Together, these changes reaffirm who we are as a United States Air Force – a team bound by history, strengthened by pride, and united in a shared purpose. Fight's On!
